\* We don't actually know much about the **historic dam**. As this area is prized for its rolling hills and fertile soil, with a long history of agriculture and farming, it seems likely the dam was used to create a farm pond.

The Lenape Native Americans were the first inhabitants of this area and the one square mile town of Kennett Square came from the original land grant of William Penn. General Sir William Howe marched through Kennett to the Battle of the Brandywine during the American Revolution. Additionally, Kennett Square was also known as an important part of the Underground Railroad.
